Boyz II Men, Terri Clark and more hit the main stage in '08

PLEASANTON, CA – March 20, 2008 – The first round of headliners have been announced for the Alameda County Fair's summer line-up. The annual Fair, which runs from June 20th through July 6th this year, features a wide variety of world-class music and comedy in its 3,000-seat Amphitheater. Artists perform two shows nightly, at 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. All concerts are free with Fair admission.

Saturday, June 21 will feature Canadian country music artist Terri Clark. Only Terri Clark, a woman in full, a Country Music Association and Academy of Country Music Top Female Vocalist nominee and Grand Ole Opry member, could release a song called "Dirty Girl" - and make it about four-wheeling and tearing down engines. But then Terri Clark, who brings her own brand of smolder to turbo-traditional country music, has always been more about a broken-in pair of Justin Boots than the latest Jimmy Choo stilettos. Starting with her 1995 debut single "Better Things to Do", Clark has charted several singles on both the U.S. and Canadian country music charts, in addition to releasing six studio albums and a Greatest Hits compilation.

The most successful R&B male vocal group of all time will take the stage on Sunday, June 22. Boyz II Men is a three-time Grammy Award-winning American R&B/soul singing group from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Boyz II Men garnered 5 number-one hits in the 1990s and has sold more than 60 million records. Three of its #1 hits, "End of the Road", "I'll Make Love to You", and "One Sweet Day" (with Mariah Carey), set and broke records for the longest period of time a single remained at #1 on the Billboard Hot 100. This will be one show to arrive early to save your seats.

Paul Rodriguez brings his special brand of comedy to the Fair on Sunday, June 29th. His career as an actor and comedian spans more than two decades, performing to over a million concert-goers, and includes starring roles and featured appearances in over 30 films and

countless television series and specials. Paul is an actor, comedian, director, writer and producer, and served as both executive producer and star of the comedy concert film “The Original Latin Kings of Comedy.”

Thursday, July 3rd, marks the return of War, the first and most successful musical crossover phenomenon that forever fused rock, jazz, Latin, and R&B, while transcending racial and cultural barriers with a multi-ethnic lineup and a multi-platinum sound. This musical melting pot has been an enduring influence that has sold over 50 million records to date. 17 Gold, Platinum and Multi Platinum Album Awards and 12 Top 40 Hits. Hits include “Low Rider,” “Why Can’t We Be Friends,” “Spill The Wine,” “The Cisco Kid,” and “Slippin’ Into Darkness.”
